

Academic Scholarship Application Priority Deadline: December 1

MSU offers academic scholarships to those students with high academic credentials. Standardized test scores and grade point average are the primary basis upon which awards are made. Courses taken, extracurricular participation, and leadership are also used in the selection of scholarship recipients.

To be considered for academic scholarships, you must:

- Complete the Application for Admission and the Academic Scholarship Application.
- Include an unofficial transcript when returning the application. NOTE: For students graduating from state-approved Louisiana high schools on or after May 2003, the paper high school transcript is not required. This information will be accessed through the Louisiana Student Transcript System.
- Have official ACT/SAT scores forwarded to McNeese State University from the testing company (first-time freshmen only).

Scholarship Information

Each year over \$3.5 million in scholarships and awards are disbursed to McNeese students. Academic scholarships are awarded on a competitive basis to qualified full-time students who remain in good standing. Scholarships in music, band, theatre, debate, and rodeo are also available to McNeese students. Please contact the specific department for additional information on scholarship opportunities in these areas. Scholarships may be used to pay for University expenses and range from \$100 to \$3,000 per semester. The priority deadline for scholarship applications is **December 1** for the upcoming academic year. A listing of available scholarships is published in the **McNeese Catalog** or online at www.mcneese.edu/scholarships.

The TOPS Scholarship Program (funded by the State of Louisiana) provides scholarships to eligible students graduating from Louisiana high schools after August 1996. Eligibility for these awards is determined by the Louisiana Office of Student Financial Assistance (LOSFA) in Baton Rouge. McNeese and private scholarships may be utilized in addition to the TOPS award as long as the total awards from all sources do not exceed the established cost of attendance.

Honors College

Created to meet the intellectual needs and expectations of highly motivated students, the Honors College strengthens McNeese State University's commitment to providing the guidance and personal instruction that supports excellence in undergraduate education. The Honors College is designed for outstanding students with strong academic backgrounds who desire an alternative course of instruction at the college level. Multidisciplinary honors courses, independent studies, and opportunities to study abroad are available to Honors College participants.

Students who participate in the Honors College may be awarded financial assistance toward tuition and fees, residence hall and meal fees, or book expenditures. Students will also receive a special designation on University transcripts for honors courses.

Criteria for admission into the Honors College include: a composite ACT score of 27 or a total SAT score of 1210 and an overall high school GPA of 3.4. Additional considerations for admission will be the student's high school transcripts, a written essay, interview, and three letters of recommendation.

McNeese Access Award (Non-Resident Fee Waiver)

Non-resident students (from other states) enrolling at McNeese for the **first time** who meet specific criteria may apply for a waiver of non-resident fees.

First-time freshmen or undergraduate transfers with less than 12 college-level hours may receive a non-resident fee waiver if they meet the following criteria:

1. A minimum ACT composite score of 21 (or minimum SAT score of 980)
AND
2. A cumulative high school GPA of 2.25 or higher on an unweighted 4.0 scale
AND
3. Have no need for remedial coursework.

Transfer students who have completed at least 12 hours of college-level course work may receive a non-resident fee waiver if they meet the following criteria:

1. A cumulative GPA of 2.5 on college-level work **AND**
2. Have no need for remedial coursework.

Students admitted under these criteria will remain eligible to retain this waiver as long as they maintain satisfactory academic progress (2.0 cumulative GPA) and full-time status.

Students who do not meet the criteria for the non-resident fee waiver described above may qualify for one of several other non-resident fee waivers available at McNeese. Detailed information is available in the **McNeese Catalog** or on the Web site at: www.mcneese.edu/scholarships.

The Access Award/Non-Resident Waiver Application is available on the Web site or from the Office of Scholarships and Testing. To apply for the waiver, students should submit the waiver form, the admissions application, applicable transcripts, and/or test scores.

Note: Students may be declared a Louisiana resident if either parent is a graduate of McNeese.
